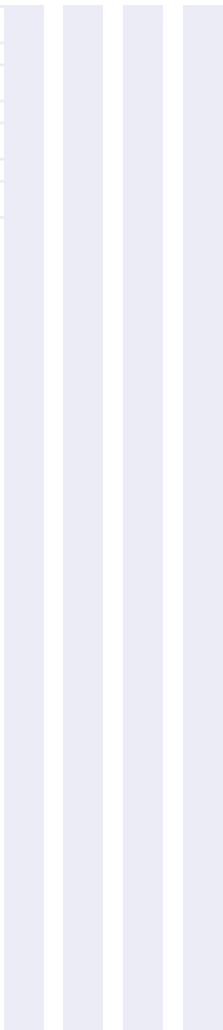

Prevention Programs

Promotion of Joint Program to prevent School Accidents

To ensure the continuity and effectiveness of the school accident prevention program in accordance with the "Act on the Prevention of and Compensation for Accidents at School." We continuously seek ways to enhance and develop school safety policies in cooperation with the Ministry of Education and Municipal and provincial offices of education.



Support for the Basic Plan on School Accident Prevention

SSIF supports the development and implementation of the basic plan for school accident prevention at the national level, which is formulated every three years by the Minister of Education, in accordance with the "Act on the Prevention of and Compensation for Accidents at School."

Enabling Field-Oriented Safety Education in Schools

We support the enhancement and activation of safety education tailored to the characteristics of the school site, in consideration of students, faculty, and participants in educational activities.

- Development and distribution of safety education content
- Creation and rollout of training materials using cutting-edge technologies such as VR and the metaverse.
- Support for experience-based safety training for faculty and staff
- Safety education support programs tailored for students from multicultural backgrounds and with disabilities
- Management and support of a specialized instructor pool for school safety education



Support for the Enhancement of Experience-Based Safety Education

To enhance students' and educators' capacity to respond swiftly and effectively to safety incidents, SSIF provides the only professional consulting service in Korea for Student Safety Experience Centers operated by municipal and provincial offices of education nationwide. Additionally, we deliver tailored safety education programs to students in remote and underserved areas, including islands.

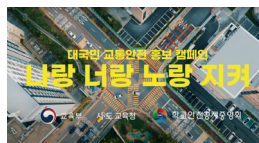

Promoting a Culture of Child Traffic Safety and Improving the School Commute Environment

In response to the increasing risk of pedestrian accidents involving children, we are implementing traffic safety campaigns and educational initiatives to ensure safe commuting routes for students.

Development of Customized Measures for Different Types of Disasters

SSIF supports disaster preparedness training led by school members and develops and distributes customized disaster safety education materials for elementary, middle, and high schools.

- Production and distribution of disaster safety education content

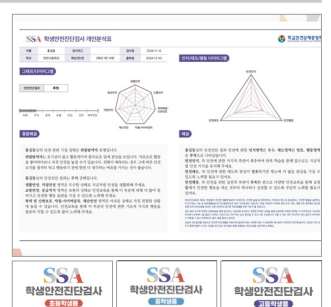


Development of School Safety Assessment(SSA) Tool

School Safety Assessment (SSA) is a diagnostic tool developed to strengthen the safety awareness and safety behavior capabilities of elementary, middle, and high school students nationwide. It was created based on the seven standards for school safety education proposed by the Ministry of Education and supports more systematic and effective safety education by analyzing the safety-related tendencies of individual students.

Composition and Results

- Non-scored representation of safety-related characteristics and dispositions
- Visual analysis of the seven standard areas of school safety education based on diagrams
- Comprehensive analysis of safety perception, safety attitude, and safety behavior
- Establishment of a customized safety education and school safety policy feedback system for students



School Safety Policy Research and Development of New Programs

We analyze school safety issues and the current situation, reflect the opinions of school staff in developing effective policies, and use this as a basis for planning and implementing new programs to develop customized safety policies and innovative implementation models.

Establishment and Operation of School Safety Support System

By integrating 14 systems related to school safety, we support more efficient prevention of school accidents and build and operate a user-oriented integrated support system to enable more effective applications at schools.

Management of National Statistics (School Accident-Related Statistics)

SSIF systematically collects, analyzes, and manages school accident-related data as nationally approved statistics, providing a basis for their prevention and the establishment of applicable policies.

Insurance

University Accident Compensation Insurance Program

We compensate university presidents’ legal liability and students’ damages caused by accidents that occur at universities.

We offer reasonable insurance fees with minimum expenses compared to private insurance companies.	As a Ministry of Education-designated itemized university information disclosure management agency, we share safety management information effectively to streamline administrative procedures.

We are an institution entrusted to execute state programs, which allows us to enter into private contracts regardless of the amount of subscription.	Online notification of accidents and claims for compensation allows users to directly check the progress and number of accidents.

Youth Activity Safety Insurance

We promptly and appropriately compensate for damage caused by accidents that occur during activities conducted by youth training facilities or youth organizations.

Youth training facilities

- Beneficiaries: Youth, General Users
- Compensation eligibility
 - ① Damage to life, body, and property suffered by beneficiaries due to an accident that occurred during a youth training activity
 - ② Personal and material damage to a third party caused by beneficiaries

Youth organizations

- Beneficiaries: Youth, Youth leaders, and Participants in youth activities
- Compensation target
 - ① Damage to life, body, and property suffered by the insured due to an accident that occurred during a youth organization activity
 - ② Personal and material damage to a third party caused by beneficiaries

School Liability Insurance

It relieves the legal liability for damages borne by school members due to accidents involving liability* that occur during educational activities.

*Liability: Legal responsibility for a person who has infringed on the rights of others to pay for the damages

Scope of Compensation

- Personal or material damage to a third party caused by an accident related to educational activities or labor by school staff*
 - Damage to vehicles of staff and participants in educational activities due to accidents related to educational activities or labor by school staff*
 - Damage to or loss of students’ personal belongings under school management
 - Penalty imposed on the school principal under Article 101 of the “Food Sanitation Act”
- * Mowing the lawn, sorting garbage, cooking school lunches, and other labor tasks as directed by the school principal.

Safety Insurance for Overseas Korean Schools


We compensate for the damage caused to students and faculty members during educational activities at overseas Korean schools and support the protection of the rights and interests of overseas Koreans and the stabilization of school operations.

Scope of Compensation

- Personal injury suffered by students and faculty members due to accidents that occurred during educational activities
- Diseases directly caused by affairs managed by the school principal

Operation and Support of the School Safety Insurance System

Research on Improvement Measures for the School Safety Insurance System

SSIF identifies shortcomings in the operation of the insurance and prepares improvement plans to minimize disputes between stakeholders regarding school accident compensation. To support quick recovery from damage, our improvement plans are developed by experts in related fields who conduct status surveys and analyze problems.

- Review and research on the appropriateness of the detailed criteria for determining the disability levels under the School Safety Act
- Review of amendments to the School Safety Act

Support for the Announcement of the Calculation Standards for School Safety Insurance Fees

In accordance with Article 49(3) of the School Safety Act, we establish clear and reasonable standards for calculating the amount of the insurance fee to support the stable operation of the insurance program by municipal and provincial school safety insurance associations.

Production and Distribution of a Handbook for the School Accident Insurance Program

We have developed and distributed a handbook to ensure timely and appropriate compensation for school accidents, standardize processing procedures, and provide up-to-date information on the operation of the insurance system, including revisions to school safety-related laws and recent legal precedents.

Legal Handbook for School Accident Insurance-Related Procedures

We organize and operate a legal advisory group to support the operation and compensation work of municipal and provincial school safety insurance associations, and constantly provide answers to questions, precedents, and other cases to support the systematic performance of compensation procedures.

Operation of the school safety insurance compensation review committee

In accordance with Article 62 of the School Safety Act, school safety insurance compensation review committees are operated to hear and decide on requests for re-examination of decisions made by the insurance compensation committee of the municipal and provincial school safety insurance associations.

Support for Capacity Building of Employees of Municipal and Provincial School Safety Insurance Associations

To improve the job performance and work efficiency of the staff members of school safety insurance federations, we provide staff training necessary for the performance of their duties by operating customized training courses for different positions and jobs.



Operation of the Council at Municipal and Provincial School Safety Insurance Associations

We are expanding information sharing and establishing a cooperative system for major issues and current matters, such as critical issues and improvement tasks of municipal and provincial school safety insurance associations, through operating councils and workshops for staff members.



Operation of Advisory Committees on Counseling and Support

SSIF supports psychological recovery through counseling and psychological therapy support for victims of school accidents at national schools and overseas Korean schools.

Support for the Operation of Teachers' Protection Insurance Program

We establish and operate a computerized system for the seamless operation of the teachers' protection insurance program and provide legal Q&A and case analysis. We also offer regular professional training for staff and produce case studies of operations and handbooks on the terms and conditions to support their work.

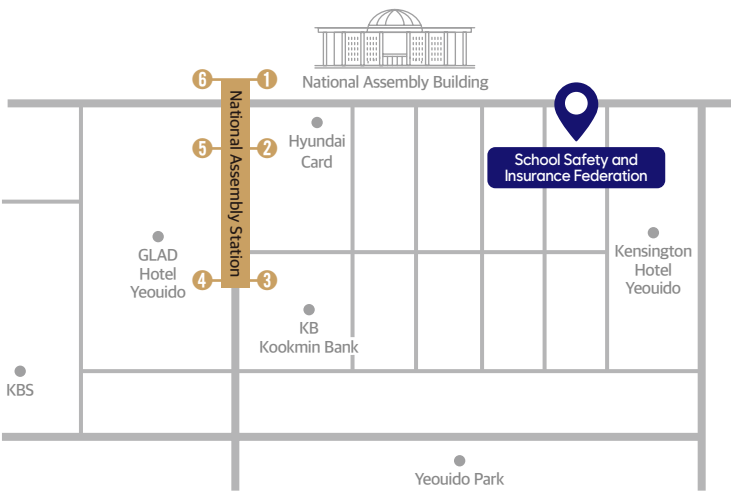
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
